01 INTRODUCING OUR NEW STATIC SEED PLANT.


During the summer of 2018, South West Seeds constructed a 'state of the art' static Seed Production Plant.

03 GRASS ESTABLISHMENT AND SOIL MANAGEMENT.

GRASS MANAGEMENT



“Get the basics right first time and you will reap the rewards”.

Seed bed preparation and the correct pH are the two most important factors in grass establishment and production. Grass leys are a very valuable crop to all livestock farmers and must be treated as such to get the best results in quality and quantity. Fertiliser is costly and is not likely to drop in price long-term. When using fertiliser, it is important to be utilising it 100%. However, this is not the case and unfortunately much of the usage is being wasted.

When speaking about different grass leys, there is a lot to consider. We have put together what we believe are they key factors in order to grow the best varieties for any grass ley. These are:

- Soil profile/type. Fertile or less fertile.
- Intensive or extensive production. High input or low inputs.
- Extensive or intensive stocking.
- Grazing, silage or both.
- Short term or long term.
- With or without clover.
- With or without herbs.
- Climate.
- High protein/ high fibre.

pH and soil testing is key to successful grass production. A low pH is the biggest cause of

financial loss and happens to be found in around 70% of the soil in the South West. Furthermore, 50% of the fertiliser will not be used or will be wasted, this will result in the production and the quality of grass being reduced.

SOIL TESTING

Testing your soil is so important. There are plenty of soil and plant tissue tests available. To understand your soils in health and nutrient value we recommend two important tests:

- Broad Spectrum Extra.This covers P, K, Ca, Mg ,S,B. Cu, Fe, Mn, Zn, Na, CEC, pH, organic matter, soil classification.
- Soil Health- Soil Biology Extra - the best test any farmer can do. This covers the real heart of soils, Total Bacteria, Total Fungi, Active Bacteria, Active Fungi – these organisms are the life blood of goods soils.

We must all start to think how we can reduce the killing of Micro Fauna in our soils and how to increase them. This is of course not easy, but with the right advice, it is very achievable. We can reduce the harmful inputs such as fertilisers and chemicals and replace them with natural products such as beneficial microbes, natural bio-stimulants and seaweed extracts. This way, the yields will not be compromised, in fact you are likely to see an increase. Additionally, you can expect to see an improvement in your animals' health.
